The Day of Welcome is a day that reminds the school that people can be themselves, including their religion, gender identity and expression, sexual orientation, race and skin color, national origin and ancestry, disability, or religion.

The Day of Welcome is a statewide initiative to welcome students into their schools and educate them about the 6 areas of bias protected by law," said Señora Irish.

This event is intended to support the people who identify with any of the six biases. The Civil Rights Team educates about bullying, including mocking someone's religion, belief, ancestry, race/color or gender. The ways the CRT display their cause is by decorating the bus doors and the lobby as well as the whole school with posters, providing activities during Advisory like slideshows and Kahoots that provide information about the six areas of bias, and lastly, providing stickers of the Day of Welcome. Their goal is to help educate the schools, and they have a bulletin board that will change every month to discuss civil rights.

"It's a kick off of the Civil Rights Team. It's really to introduce ourselves and the six areas of bias, a day where the school embraces the Day of Welcome, so we can educate the school throughout the year," said Mr. Jones.

They have also done some events last year that allowed them to join the Student Council and JMG. By this November they plan to have a conference with The Maine Youth Leadership. In the future, they will plant tulips for an event.

Civil Rights Teams have been enacting these events for 26 years with about 200 schools participating. Our school's CRT meets in the library every week on Tuesday. They are always looking for any suggestions for their cause.
